Start your day with a decadent pastry courtesy of La Petite Colombe in Lorient or Colombier. Then, make your way to Le Rooftop by L'Atelier de Joël Robuchon where you can enjoy the legendary French chef's best dishes while soaking in panoramic views of the Gustavia harbor. End your evening with dinner (and a few craft cocktails, of course) at Tamarin for a true immersion into French-Caribbean fusion. Nestled in its own tropical jungle, the restaurant's array of fresh-caught fish, reimagined traditional dishes and impressive Cave à Vin will tease your dreams for years to come.

Sunshine awaits you at all corners of St. Barths. Shell Beach presents the most striking *mise en scène* to spend hours basking in the island's glow. Complete with a selection of Greek-inspired dishes and drinks from neighboring Shellona restaurant, the historic cove offers a place to dip your toes where sand and seashells meet (as beats from the beach club provide a natural soundtrack). When your itinerary calls for relaxation, though, Gouverneur Beach is the place to be. Pristine white sands and calm surf makes this secluded getaway perfect for snorkeling and a little R&R away from the hustle and bustle of the island. Around the corner, La Plage de Saline offers yet another home base for a perfect beach day. A warning, though: locals tend to go sans suit in this cove so prepare for an all-over bronzing.
